To qualify for an Environmental Certificate, among other things, a student must write two "substantial papers on environmental or natural resources law topics." This form is to certify that the student has written one of the two required papers.

While the determination of what constitutes a "substantial" paper lies in the judgment of the faculty member, ordinarily a paper in a course that counts for more than half the course grade would probably be a "substantial" paper.

It is presumed that papers in Environmental/Natural Resources Certificate Courses (see *What's What*) would be on "environmental or natural resources law topics." In other courses or in independent study, paper topics also may be on environmental or natural resources law issues. Generally, the concept of environmental and natural resources law has been broadly construed, but in case of doubt advice can be sought from the environmental and natural resources law faculty.
