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Procedures for Penalty Grades

When the penalty grade is an “F” for the course, the Registrar will be notified by the Dean of Students. ***The student may not drop or withdraw from the class***, however, the Registrar will not formally record the failing grade until the case has been adjudicated by the College Honor Board. Should the student appeal the Board decision, the student shall be permitted to attend and fully participate in the course until the judicial process is completed. The Registrar will record a NG (no grade) pending resolution of deliberations. A failing grade may also be imposed in a course taken C/NC as an exception to the general grading practice.

All cases involving formal allegation of academic dishonesty will be adjudicated before the College Honor Board in accordance with written procedures, and disciplinary sanctions, if any, will be imposed by the College Honor Board. A disciplinary sanction is an educational tool designed to send a clear message regarding violation of College policy. Board recommended sanctions of probation, suspension, or dismissal require the additional action of the Dean of Students and the Dean of the College.

If the College Honor Board finds that the student is “not responsible” for the alleged act(s) of academic dishonesty, the College Honor Board Chair will request that the faculty member remove the penalty grade. Should the faculty member be unwilling to do so, the College Honor Board Chair will request a review of the case by the Dean of the College, who will have the authority to make a final determination.
